



In 1992 we started making our stretchers and frames for artwork using
Hoop Pine (*araucaria cunninghamii*) an Australian indigenous plantation timber.

The first plantation timber grown in Australia.

Chapman & Bailey were the first to choose a sustainable option.

We still resist old growth timbers and only use Australian hard woods for bracing
when strength is required. Our off cuts and bent timber are used to make the wedges
that expand our stretchers, resisting a plastic petro-chemical option.
